For the Nations: Refugee Outreach is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit founded in 2011 that serves refugees in the greater Dallas area. We are a Christian ministry focused on helping refugees through education and family services. Education provides job opportunities and quality of life and allows refugees to sustain their families in the USA as they are recovering from very difficult circumstances. During the education process, we explicitly and clearly share the truth of Jesus Christ.

## MISSION

To provide educational and family services that help meet the practical needs of refugees and to share with them the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Over the last several years, we have developed high quality, effective educational programs and have shared the good news of Christ with many DFW area refugees. Our vision is to bring these proven programs to more and more of the area's large refugee population.

## GOSPEL

We believe that the most important element of our ministry is sharing the hope we have in Christ. For the Nations incorporates the gospel message into everything we do. Gospel presentations and Bible lessons are a part of almost every program, event, meeting, and class... not once, but everyday. And we trust in God's promise that He will call all of His people faithfully to Himself: from every tribe, tongue, and nation. His message is not just for a few, but for the nations.

## EDUCATION

From ABC to GED, refugees have many language, literacy, and educational needs. We have English and other classes meeting every weekday in the morning and afternoon during the fall and spring semesters. These classes provide opportunities for adults and children alike to continue down the long path of adapting to life in the US. We believe quality education is a necessary foundation for their success in America. On the back of this brochure is a list of our services for adults, children, and the whole family.

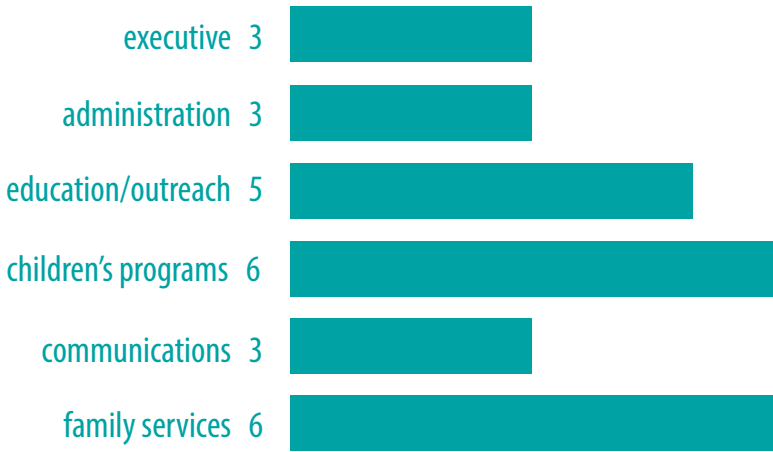
## FAMILY SERVICES

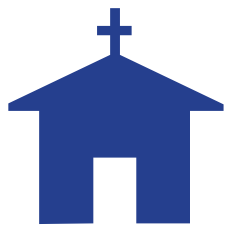

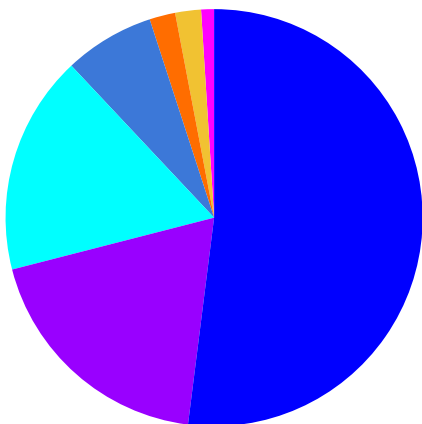

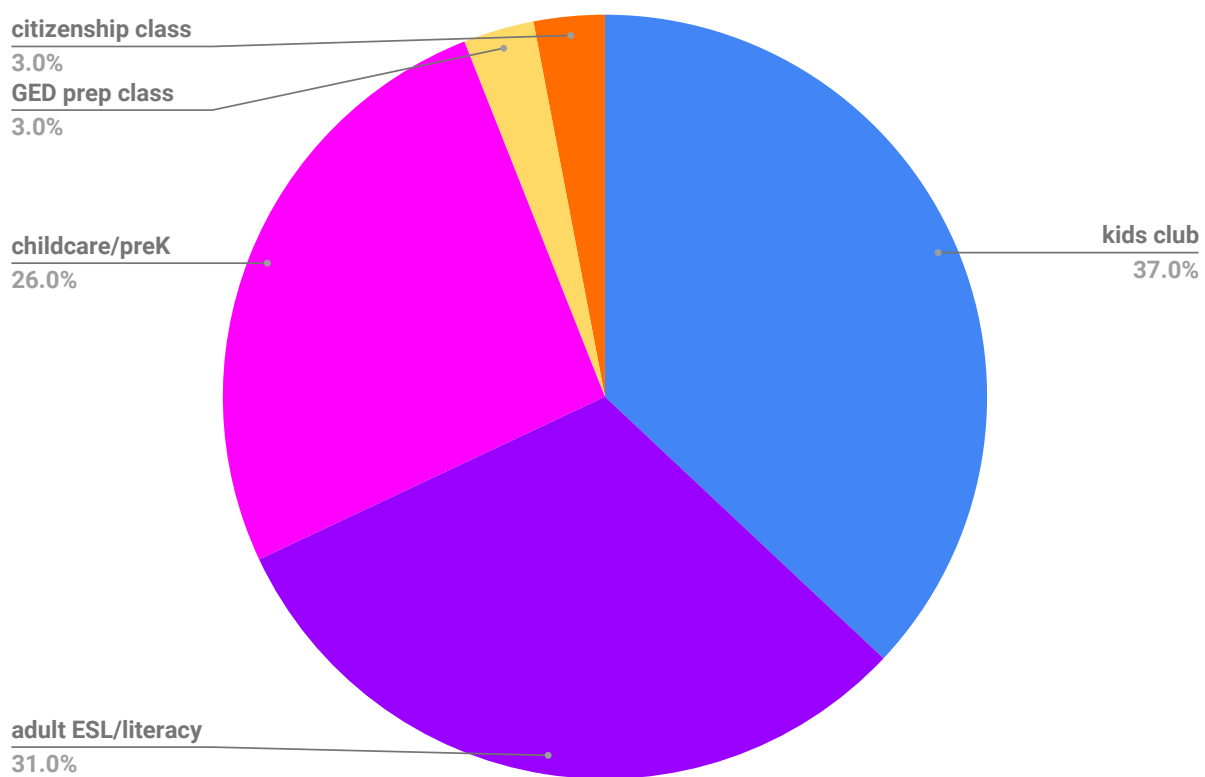

> 99% of our families live below the poverty line

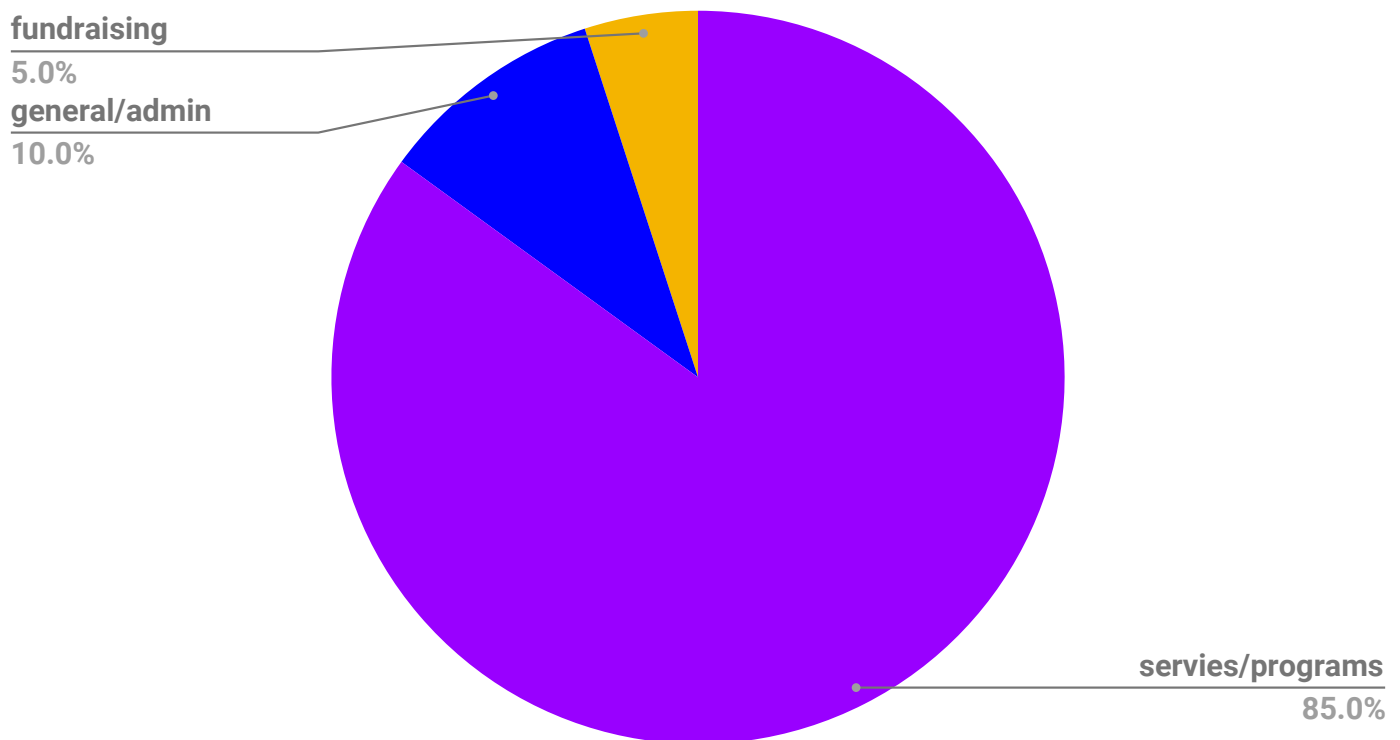
> many of these same students and families are involved in weekly Bible studies and are served by our Family Services team in various ways
